Introduction

At Relish Research Ltd, we take your privacy seriously. This privacy statement explains what personal data or information we collect from you and from people who visit our website and how we use it.

What does this policy cover?

This Privacy Policy applies only to your use of this website, <u>https://wearerelish.com/</u> ("Our Site"). Our Site may contain links to other websites. Please note that we have no control over how your data is collected, stored, or used by other websites, and we advise you to check the privacy policies of any such websites before providing any data to them.

What is personal data?

Personal data is defined by the UK GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018 (collectively, "the Data Protection Legislation") as 'any information relating to an identifiable person who can be directly or indirectly identified by reference to an identifier'.

In simpler terms, personal data is any information about you that enables you to be identified. It includes obvious information, such as your name and contact details, but it also includes less obvious information, such as identification numbers, electronic location data, and other online identifiers.

What personal data or information do we collect?

The personal information we collect may include your name, email address, mobile phone number, details about your enquiry or role you are seeking, IP address and information regarding what pages you access on this website and when we conduct market research.



How do we collect data or information from you?

We collect data or information about you when you use our website, make enquiries about our products or services, inquire about a job opportunity, or register to participate in any of our market research studies.

How is your information used?

We collect your personal data or information to operate our business effectively and provide you with the best information on our products and services.

We may use your information to:

- To carry out our obligations arising from any contract or contract negotiations entered into by you or us as a client or prospective client.
- Process an enquiry that you have made to us.
- Contact you to discuss business opportunities, products, and services that may interest you.
- To process a job application.
- Send you the requested communications, such as an enquiry about becoming a market research participant.
- To invite you to participate in a market research project.
- To validate an answer(s) you may have given in a recent study we conducted.
- To confirm you participated in a research project.
- To monitor attendance in research projects to ensure that participants do not over-attend research.

These purposes are justified based on our legitimate interest in running and promoting our business, our contractual requirements to deliver agreed-upon products or services to you, and our legal obligations. We rely on consent to complete qualitative and quantitative research and to store cookies on your device(s).

Who has access to your information?

We will never try to sell you anything or sell your personal data to anyone. That is not our business. We are not telemarketers or direct marketers. We are market researchers interested only in your opinions.

We may pass your information on to our third-party service providers, agents, or subcontractors (e.g., panel companies, qualitative fieldwork agencies) to complete a task or provide services to you on our behalf (for example, to recruit people to attend research sessions or process research responses). However, we disclose only the personal information necessary to deliver that service and have a contract that requires them to keep your information secure and not to use it for their marketing purposes.

Do we share your personal data?

We contract with the following third parties to supply services to you on our behalf: payment processing, delivery, transcription services and marketing. In some cases, those third parties may require access to some or all your personal data that we hold.

In some limited circumstances, we may be legally required to share specific personal data, including yours, if we are involved in legal proceedings or complying with legal obligations, a court order, or the instructions of a government authority. For example, by a court order or to prevent fraud or other crime.

Do we transfer your personal data outside of the United Kingdom?

We store some or all your personal data in countries outside of the UK. These are known as "third countries". We will take additional steps to ensure that your personal data is treated just as safely and securely as it would be within the UK and under the Data Protection Legislation as follows:

- The ICO issued an adequacy decision to the third country.
- Use the ICO's International Data Transfer Agreement or UK Addendum to the EU Standard Contract Clauses.
- The organisation is registered in the US with the Data Privacy Framework.
- The security of your data is essential to us, and to protect your data, we take several necessary measures, including the following:
- Limiting access to your personal data to those employees, agents, contractors, and other third parties with a legitimate need to know and ensuring that they are subject to duties of confidentiality.
- Procedures for dealing with data breaches (the accidental or unlawful destruction, loss, alteration, unauthorised disclosure of, or access to, your personal data) including notifying you and the Information Commissioner's Office where we are legally required.

How do we use cookies?

How Do You Use Cookies?

Cookies are small text sent to your browser by a website you visit. They help that website remember information about your visit, making it easier to revisit the site and make the site more useful to you. Other technologies can also be used for these purposes, including unique identifiers used to identify a browser, app or device, pixels, and local storage. Cookies and other technologies described throughout this page can be used for the below purposes.

Functional & Necessary Cookies

Cookies and other technologies used for functionality allow you to access features that are fundamental to a service. Analytics / Advertising Cookies

Cookies and other technologies used for analytics help collect data that allows services to understand how you interact with a particular service. These insights enable services to improve content and build better features that enhance your experience.

Some cookies and other technologies help sites and apps understand how visitors engage with their services. For example, Google Analytics uses cookies to collect information and report site usage statistics without personally identifying individual visitors to Google. '_ga', the main cookie used by Google Analytics, enables a service to distinguish one visitor from another and lasts two years. Any site implementing Google Analytics, including Google services, uses the '_ga' cookie. Each '_ga' cookie is unique to the specific property, so it cannot be used to track a given user or browser across unrelated websites.

Performance Cookies
